Cemetery: Sexton Deb Mioduch reported two burials this past week, and two cemetery lots sold (\$500). Assessor: The assessor requested that consideration be given to assist with the expenses relative to a required assessors' training in Gaylord. Other townships served by our assessor have all contributed towards the \$600 cost for both training and lodging. Moved by Ferguson, seconded by Pingot, to authorize \$100 towards these expenses. Roll call vote: All ayes, no nays, no absences. Motion carried.

New Business:

Supervisor Nunn raised the recent proposed zoning ordinance amendment permitting residences on industrial parcels, which was not acted upon by the board. A proposed buyer for one of those in question (which already has a residence on it) asked if the dwelling could be added to, which would change the footprint and add to the existing non-conforming use. We need to have further discussion on this, as will the planning commission.

The AV Ballot drop box was installed by contractor Gregory Pingot, Jr. at a cost of \$957.11, and the invoice has been submitted to the Bureau of Elections for reimbursement.
